

2014-2016 Community Health Assessment Implementation Plan

Every three years Speare Memorial Hospital conducts a Community Health Assessment in collaboration with the Central New Hampshire Health Partnership. The most recent assessment was completed in the fall of 2014.

The Community Health Assessment identified the following significant health needs:

- Access to mental/ behavioral health care
- Physical activity
- Diet/nutrition

Other areas of need that underscore the promotion and support of a healthier lifestyle include:

• Better management of chronic disease, including diabetes, cardiovascular and cardiopulmonary health issues.

Underlying socio-economic issues identified as barriers in the community include:

- Transportation
- Unemployment
- Food assistance
